## Grade 8 Health - Drug Awareness PowerPoint Project

In groups of 2 , or individually, students will be creating a Slides presentation on a drug concern of their choice. The title, pictures, and answers to the following W5 questions must be included (who, what, where, when, why, and how):

1. Who uses the drug?
2. What is it made out of? What do people add to it? And what type of drug is it? (e.g. Is it legal or illegal? Is it a stimulant, hallucinogen, or depressant?)
3. Where does it come from/originate in history?
4. When was it first used/created in history?
5. Why do people continue to use it today?
6. How does the drug affect your body in the short and long term? Good and bad? How does it affect people's behaviour? How does it affect people's relationships with others, friends and family?
7. Provide at least 2 interesting facts.

When presentations have been completed students will provide the class with a brief, 3-5 minute, presentation on the information that has been found.
